

Primary School Sports Grant Impact and Evaluation Report Academic Year 2016/17

Context of Academy

Green Lane Primary Academy (GLPA) is a two-form institution set in the suburban district of Garforth. The academy has close general links with other academies through the School Partnership Trust Academies (SPTA).

GLPA also has close links in sport to local primary schools through the School Sport Partnership (SSP). These links are maintained through regular meetings between Primary Link Teachers where best practice in Physical Education and School Sport (PESS) is shared and inter-school competitions are planned. City-wide connections in school sport are achieved through communication between the academy and our designated School Games Organiser (SGO).

The academy has a history of success in a wide range of sports on community, city and county levels.

Objectives of Primary School Sports Funding

General objectives (subject to reflection and amendment):

- All teachers confident in teaching all strands of PE in the curriculum.
- All lesson observations/learning peeps demonstrating high quality PE teaching.
- All children taking part in 2 hours of PE per week.
- Majority of children displaying positive attitudes to PE, school sport and physical activity.
- All children understanding the need for a healthy lifestyle and how to achieve that.
- Majority of children achieving age-related expectations in PE.
- Majority of children taking part in sporting activity once per week.

Summary of PSSG Spending

The cost of £2640 for the TLR role was deemed to be an important expenditure this year as it is the TLR holder who ensures a wide range of competitions, with pathways through to city competitions, are open to our children. We have taken full advantage of these competitions (winning some of them) giving children positive experiences in sport.

Spending on the TLR role also ensured that a greater amount of intra-academy sport competitions could take place. These competitions gave access to competitive sport to children who may not have had the opportunity to represent the academy in inter-school sport. This year, we progressed from the Bronze to the Silver School Games Mark.

Because participation in competitive sport has been the focus this year, we have seen a rise in the amount of children accessing sport in all age phases. Our previous years' focus of developing staff was rewarded this year as GLPA won the West Yorkshire Primary PE and Sport Premium Award in the category of up-skilling staff.

Children in UKS2 have had experiences in cross country, gymnastics, football, cricket, rugby, rounders and athletics. 68% of UKS2 have represented GLPA in inter-school or inter-house sport. Children in LKS2 have had experiences in cross country, football, skipping, dodgeball and new-age kurling. 67% of children in LKS2 have represented GLPA in inter-school or inter-house sport. Children in KS1 have had experiences in multi-skills and football. 30% of KS1 have represented GLPA in inter-school or inter-house sport Sport and Change4Life clubs have ensured that more children than ever have had the opportunity to participate in a club activity. GLPA won the West Yorkshire Primary PE and Sport Premium Award in the category of up-skilling staff. GLPA progressed from the Bronze to the Silver School Games Mark.

Other Supporting Evidence of Impact

Green Lane won the West Yorkshire Primary PE and Sport Premium Award in the category of up-skilling staff.

More children than ever were assessed as being at the age related expectation in PE this year.

Implications for PSSG in 2017/18

The TLR role should continue to be funded to ensure children can access a wide range of competitions; to ensure that teachers are supported in planning, teaching and assessing PE; to track children's participation in sporting activity and to track PE attainment.

Change4Life clubs should continue to be staffed and equipped.

Support from external coaches in target areas may also be funded.
