

Phonics Progression

The phase 3 and 5 sounds are attached with images to show how the sound is pronounced.

Sound Buttons

These are used to mark each sound in a word. If there is one letter for the sound, use a dot. If there are 2 or more letters for the sound, use a line. If there is a split digraph, use a curved line to link the vowel to the 'e'.
