Parental Behaviour

We have reports of parents arguing and using threatening and abusive language towards each other on school premises. We would like to remind parents to consider their behaviour and the impact on the children, families and staff who attend Green Lane. No one should have to encounter this type of behaviour. Parents are expected to behave in a respectful and reasonable manner towards each other. We would not become involved in parental disputes and would advise parent to seek support from the Police in matters like this. If parental behaviour was an ongoing concern, we would consider a site ban, if steps to stop this type of behaviour were unsuccessful.

Parking

Please note that we have a disabled parking bay to support people with a blue badge. Please display your blue badge when using the space – new signage has been ordered to support this. Please respect that the space is to support people with disabilities, so should be used within the terms of possessing a blue badge.

Please note that parents are not able to use the disabled bay in the staff car park as this is not a public space and need to be available for people who work at the school or trust.

We were singing the songs while we were on the coach on the way there it was ... INCREDIBLE


